



Dandelion Clock Block by Jo Avery

Introduction

Explore Jo's Freehand Foundation Piecing technique in this skills-based workshop. We will be drawing up our own Dandelion Clock freehand on to a foundation fabric before foundation piecing and then tackling wonky improv curves. You will hopefully finish at least one quarter which can be used as a stand-alone block (measuring 12") or you can make three more to create a full circle as shown. This would make a fabulous mini quilt or large pillow or make more blocks for a full-sized quilt. It's also a great scrappy project.

Workshop Requirements (per quarter block)

These are the minimum fabric requirements for those attending classroom workshops, as you will all be at home you can add more in during the day as and when you need it.

1 x fat quarter for background

2 different 10" pieces for the wonky curves

5 to 7 different fabrics, each around 4" to 7" for the wedges

A pack or at least 12" square of medium or light sew-in interfacing (non-woven is best)*

Pencil

Fine tipped Permanent pen

Rotary cutter (28mm if you have one, otherwise 45mm is fine), cutting mat and ruler

12.5" square ruler if you have one

Sewing machine with quarter inch foot.
